Construction Changes Look of Buildings

You may have noticed some changes at our buildings over the summer, as construction crews were busy bringing solar power to our schools and making other improvements as part of two different capital projects.

Installation of solar panels on the roof of each Red Hook Central School District building is expected to provide about a quarter of the power the district uses each year, resulting in an estimated savings of between \$85,000 and \$90,000. The community approved the project in 2019.

The balance of the summer work was done as part of the \$22 million capital project approved in 2022. Nearly all the schools will see some new windows.

Red Hook High School

A new ice storage unit was installed along with the associated primary piping from the gym/auditorium to the main hallway and main classroom hallway. Completion of that work is expected next summer when new windows and ventilators will be installed. The ice storage unit will allow the district to cool both the auditorium/gym and classrooms more efficiently.

Linden Avenue Middle School

A new roof, some new windows and a digital controller for the HVAC system.

Mill Road

Some new windows with others for non-classroom areas slated throughout the school year with completion expected next summer.





RHHS International Baccalaureate Program

The full International Baccalaureate Diploma involves completing advanced coursework in six distinct areas (i.e., language and literature, language acquisition, individuals and societies, experimental sciences, mathematics and computer science, and the arts). All students must complete a Theory of Knowledge course that includes a Community Action Service Project and a 4,000-word essay. All final assessments are evaluated and graded by external evaluators from the International Baccalaureate Organization (IBO).

We thank the community for its continued support of this important program. It has allowed our full diploma candidates as well as hundreds of other students to access rigorous, college-level curricula while attending RHHS. The IB Program first became a part of the educational program at the high school in September 2002. Admission of Nonresident Students

In 2014, the Board of Education adopted a policy allowing non-resident, tuition-paying students to request admission to our schools. When the Superintendent of Schools determines that classroom space is available and the district can offer such placement without incurring any additional cost to the taxpayers of Red Hook Central School District, it is the policy of the Board of Education to admit non-resident students to its schools upon the payment of tuition. Tuition rates are set annually by the Board of Education in accordance with the laws and regulations of the State of New York. Attendance MATTERS!

Did you know that regular attendance is one of the most important determinants of your child's success in school? We encourage you to schedule all nonemergency absences from school – routine medical or dental appointments – for after school hours, and to plan vacations for days that school is not in session. The negative impact of missing school for more than 10 percent of the school year (about 18 days total) whether absences are excused or unexcused is the same. Poor attendance in the early grades (kindergarten through second grade) can influence whether your child will be reading proficiently by the end of third grade. Chronic absenteeism in the secondary grades (6 – 12) is a leading indicator that a student will drop out of school before completing graduation requirements.

Safe Arrival

Safe Arrival is a way for parents/guardians to report student absences. It replaces having to submit handwritten notes or contact your child's school attendance clerk to report MOST absences. The system requires authorized parents/guardians to create an account which then links them to their student(s) for the purpose of absence reporting. Parents of students in grades PK - 12 who are marked absent AND for whom we do not have a reported reason, will receive an automated phone call from the district regarding that absence. We encourage you to use the Safe Arrival system to manage your student(s) absences. For more details about Safe Arrival and how to create an account, please visit the district website.





School Safety, Security and Reporting Concerns

We continue to prioritize school safety and security. School safety drills are an integral part of our preparedness plan. We conduct all our mandatory drills, including fire drill and lockdown drills. To keep up to date and further strengthen our safety practices, we have building and district safety team meetings which bring key staff and law enforcement together to review, assess and update our plans. These ongoing meetings allow us to be informed about the latest safety protocols and best practices. As an integral part of our safety initiatives, we will continue with our School Resource Officer (SRO) program in our school buildings. We have dedicated, experienced law enforcement officers from Red Hook Police Department who work closely with our school community to ensure a safe and secure learning environment. The SROs work to build positive relationships with our students, staff, and community which promotes trust and constant, open communication. We encourage all families to discuss safety with their children and report any messages, content or conversations that are inappropriate, potentially harmful or concerning.

In today's digital era, online interactions are a significant part of the lives of our children. The district has the Say Something Reporting System for students and adults to easily and confidentially report safety concerns to help prevent violence and tragedies. Say Something is provided by Sandy Hook Promise — a national violence prevention nonprofit organization —focused on preventing gun violence (and other forms of violence and victimization) by educating and mobilizing youth and adults to identify, intervene and get help for individuals who may be at-risk of hurting themselves or others. Say Something is not a replacement for 911 and should NOT be use in the event of an emergency or a crime in progress. least 30 days prior to the vote date and registered to vote. If a person is registered to vote in a general election and has voted within the past four years, there is no need to register separately for the school district vote. If a person is not registered, a voter registration date will be established by the district for school district-only elections OR you can register with the county Board of Elections by completing the New York State Voter Registration form found online at https://www.elections.ny.gov. MySchoolBucks.com Parent Portal

The District's Cafeteria Program manages a parent portal for the Point-of-Sale breakfast and lunch program.

The online parent portal allows parents to access their child's breakfast/lunch account from any computer connected to the Internet. From the portal web site, parents can make advance payments for breakfast &/or lunch by using a debit or credit card or an e-check; view their child's fund balance and see what their child is buying in the cafeteria. We encourage parents to create an online account! (Payments are also accepted in person via check or cash in each school building.)

To create your online parent portal account, you will need to visit www.mySchoolBucks.com and follow the online directions found there. Keep in mind that payments can be made for all your children at one time by using the mySchoolBucks portal. Please remember that each time you make a deposit to MySchoolBucks.com, there is a processing charge. Plan ahead and deposit funds for all your children in one transaction to avoid multiple processing charges.
